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COVID RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL APPLY TO ALL SECTIONS

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

The attention of exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society in addition to any Special Regulations which might appear within this schedule

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Only competitors or exhibitors can lodge protests.
- Competitors shall at all times behave in a proper and courteous manner to Judges, officials and other competitors. Should a competitor behave in an offensive or improper manner, the Chief Steward of that section shall have the right to exclude and disqualify that competitor from competing in the section.
- 3. Competitors compete at own risk.
- 4. All care taken but no responsibility will be accepted by the Society for damage of any exhibit including broken glass.
- 5. The Committee reserves the right to alter or delete any part of the program.
- The prizes will be awarded subject to the appended General Regulations and Conditions and Notes as set forth in the Prize Schedule and are to be the conditions of competition.
- 7. Exhibits entered in the wrong class by the exhibitor may be transferred to the proper class by the Stewards.
- 8. An exhibitor or his/her agent, who shall make a false report, or give misleading information or suppress necessary information in respect of any exhibit, shall be held to have forfeited any prizes gained by those means. The exhibit and exhibitor, together with agent (if any) may be disqualified and the matter reported to the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies.
- 9. The Society will not be responsible for any accident caused through or by any exhibit, and will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of livestock or other exhibits of any kind, or any damage done thereto.
- 10. All exhibits must be delivered to and removed from the grounds at the cost and risk of the exhibitor.
- 11. The Judges may recommend Certificates for any exhibit not included in this Schedule and will not award prizes in classes in which the exhibits are not considered to possess sufficient merit.
- 12. All other matters shall be subject to the rules of the Society.
- 13. No decoration or Award Cards, except such as are provided by the committee, shall be placed on any exhibit or affixed thereto at the Exhibition then being held.
- 14. For Champion Prizes, all first winners of the breed and sex to compete. After selection of the Champion, the Judge will be required to select an animal for "Reserve Champion", which shall take the place of the Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause. The Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining first prize animals together with the second prize winner of the class which furnished the Champion.
- 15. Order of events in the Schedule shall be at the discretion of the Committee.
- 16. Space Hirers are to ensure that ALL power leads and electrical appliances display a current tag indicating that each lead has been tested and approved by an authorised person in accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Health & Safety Act.

DUTIES OF EXHIBITORS & STEWARDS:

Exhibitors:

- Exhibitors must complete nomination form, with a description of the exhibits, and the number of the class they wish to compete in. Please write clearly.
- 2. Exhibits must not be removed without the permission of the Stewards.

Stewards:

- 1. Chief Stewards' names will appear in the Show Schedule.
- 2. Stewards must be in attendance at the Showgrounds at the hour approved to receive exhibits.
- 3. Stewards are responsible for the proper classification of exhibits and all exhibits must be ready for judging.
- Any exhibit suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be immediately reported to the Secretary, who shall order its removal.
- 5. Stewards shall remove exhibitors and other persons from the vicinity of the judging while judging takes place.
- Stewards shall attend on the Judges to afford any information required but will not do or say anything to influence their decision. They must not reveal the name of any exhibitor or repeat the remarks the Judges may make to each other.
- 7. The Stewards will obtain the Announcer Sheet from the Judges when completed and deliver to the Secretary.

NOTICE TO PAVILION ENTRANTS

It is important that the entries be sent in as early as possible to enable the Committee to provide the necessary display space. All Pavilion Entries may be collected from 4pm on the afternoon of the Show. Please contact Section Steward. All Pavilion Prize money shall be payable at their respective pavilions after the Grand Parade. All prizes not collected within three (3) months after the Show will be deemed to be donated back to the Society.

PLEASE NOTE: ENTRY TO THE RINGS IS RESTRICTED TO SHOW OFFICIALS AND COMPETITORS, AND NO UNAUTHORISED PERSONS WILL BE PERMITTED IN RING.

VERSATILITY RANCH HORSE General information. The Versatility Ranch Horse demonstrates the performance, versatility, and conformation of a working horse. The intent is to reward an exhibitor and/or horse based on their level of expertise.

a) No horse under 3 years of age may be exhibited; b) No hoof polish/black; c) No braided or banded manes/tails or tail extensions; d) Trimming inside ears is discouraged. Trimming bridle path is allowed, also trimming of fetlocks or excessive (long) facial hair; Silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged; e) Holding the saddle horn with either hand will not be penalized in any class; f) Posting or standing in stirrups at extended trot is acceptable.

VERSATILITY RANCH HORSE General information continued -

. Snaffle Bit – Any Horse 3 years & over. Horse to be ridden 2 handed in a Snaffle Bit regardless of horse's age.

Equipment: Western, Fender, Stock Saddle or Half-breed Saddle. Leather strap attached below the reins on a Snaffle Bit is acceptable.

Senior horses - six (6) years and over must be shown in a Western Bit (one handed)
Junior horses - three (3) years old to five (5) years old must be shown with either a Western Bit (one handed), or Hackamore or Snaffle Bit (two handed)


Western Attire - it is mandatory to wear a Long Sleeve Shirt with collar (band, stand-up, tuxedo, etc.). Western Hat (or helmet as required), Long Pants/Jeans. Spurs, chinks, and chaps are optional in ridden classes. NB: Spurs are not to be used forward of the cinch. Tendon Boots, splint boots, leg wraps and bandages are allowed in Versatility Ranch classes except for Ranch Conformation. The Versatility Ranch Conformation class must be held after the conclusion of the other events; Horses must have competed in at least 1 ridden class in their respective division to compete. Horses are to be shown in hand in a good working Halter - rope, braided nylon or plain leather.



Novice/Open Working Stock Horse Pattern






VERSATILITY RANCH REINING Pattern 6



Ride pattern as follows: Trot to centre of arena and stop or walk before departure. Start pattern facing toward Judge

- Beginning on right lead, lope one (1) circle to the right. Change leads at centre of arena
- 2. Complete one (1) circle to the left. Change leads at centre of arena
- Begin a circle to the right but do not close this circle. Run down centre of arena past end marker and do a sliding stop
- 4. Complete 31/2 spins to the right
- 5. Run up to the other end of arena, past end marker and do a sliding stop
- 6. Complete 3½ spins to the left
- Run past centre marker and do a sliding stop. Back at least 3 m. Hesitate to show completion of pattern

VERSATILITY RANCH PLEASURE Pattern 2



- 1. Walk from 1 to 2
- 2. Lope from 2 to 3
- 3. Extend lope from 3 to 4
- 4. Trot from 4 to 5
- 5. Stop at 5, reverse (either direction)
- 6. Extend walk from 6 to 7
- 7. Trot from 7 to 8
- 8. Extend trot from 8 to 9
- 9. Lope from 9 to 10
- Stop at 10 and back approximately one (1) horse length

COOKING JUDGE COMMENTS: READ SCHEDULE CAREFULLY

BISCUITS

When cooked, put biscuits into airtight container. Judges look for flavour, crispness, light golden colour, dainty and attractive appearance. In a variety, each different shape should be a different recipe.

PLUM PUDDING

Never let water go off boil and keep it 2/3 up the side of the pudding. Slice cherries in quarters.

SCONES

Brush off surplus flour. Do not have oven too slow. Never screw cutter into the dough. Sieve pumpkin for pumpkin scones and cakes. An even size is desirable.

JAMS

Plastic lids taint and don't seal. It is difficult to remove peanut odour from peanut paste jars.

FRUIT CAKES

Cut fruit evenly to currant size. Never put bowl scrapings into the centre of cake. For a smooth top, after placing mixture into tin and before placing in oven, wet your hand and pat all fruit down. Bumping your cake tin on the table before putting in oven, helps eliminate air bubbles. For a Rich Fruit Cake, when cooked and still hot, wrap in greaseproof paper, then cloth. This keeps cake moist and draws cracks together.

DARK RICH FRUIT CAKE This recipe must be used for Class 18 in the Cooking Section

Ingredients:

750g Sultanas 250g Butter

250g Raisins 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)

125g Currants 4 x 60g eggs

125g Mixed Peel 1 dessert spoon Parisian essence

125g Glace Cherries 1 teaspoon lemon essence

1 teaspoon grated orange rind 1 teaspoon vanilla essence

1 teaspoon grated lemon rind 2 cups Plain flour

½ cup rum, brandy or sherry 2 teaspoons mixed spice

Method:

Place in a large mixing bowl, sultanas, currants and peel. Use scissors to cut up raisins the same size as sultanas, quarter the cherries and add to bowl with rum and fruit rinds, mix well. Cover and seal for 3-7 days, do not add more rum later. Have eggs and butter at room temperature. Beat butter until it just clings to sides of basin, do not beat until pale in colour, add sugar (sift if lumpy). Beat only to combine, add eggs one at a time and beat only until each egg has been absorbed by the butter mix. Mix sifted flour and spice into fruit and add creamed mixture and essence, mix well. Place into a prepared 8" square tin and bake 3 to 3 ½ hours at a constant low temperature. Do not store in aluminium foil unless wrapped in greaseproof paper first.
